## Introduction

This notice describes how we collect, store, transfer and use personal data. It tells you about your privacy rights and how the law protects you.

In the context of the law and this notice, 'personal data' is information that clearly identifies you as an individual or which could be used to identify you if combined with other information. Acting in any way on personal data is referred to as 'processing'.

This notice applies to personal data collected through our website and through social media platforms and online retail platforms, including Facebook, Instagram, Twitter, Linked In, Pinterest and music platforms as distributed via CD Baby.

Except as set out below, we do not share, or sell, or disclose to a third party, any information collected through our website.

## 1. How we obtain personal data

The information we process about you includes information:

a) you have directly provided to us -when you use our website, our services or buy from us

b) as a result of monitoring how you use our website or our services

#### This can include:

- **personal identifiers**, such as your first and last names, your title and your date of birth
- **contact information**, such as your email address, your telephone number and your postal addresses for billing, delivery and communication
- **account information**, including your username and password used to access our website and our services
- **payment information** is never taken by us or transferred to us either through our website or otherwise. At the point of payment, you are transferred to a secure page on the website of PayPal. That page may be branded to look like a page on our website, but it is not controlled by us.

- **transaction information** including details of the products services you have bought from us and payments made to us for those services
- **records of communication** between us including messages sent through our website, email messages and telephone conversations
- **information you contribute to our community,** including reviews, replies to polls and surveys, comments
- marketing preferences that tell us what types of marketing you would like to receive
- **technical information** requests by your web browser to our servers for web pages and other content on our website are recorded. We record information such as your geographical location, your Internet service provider and your IP address. We also record information about the software you are using to browse our website, such as the type of computer or device and the screen resolution. We use this information in aggregate to assess the popularity of the webpages on our website and how we perform in providing content to you.

## 2. Your personal data is not shared

We do not share or disclose to a third party, any information collected through our website

#### 3. Special personal data

We do not collect any special personal data about you concerning your race or ethnicity, religious or philosophical beliefs, sex life, sexual orientation, political opinions, trade union membership, information about your health and genetic and biometric data.

4. Information we process because we have a contractual obligation with you When you create an account on our website, buy a product or service from us, or otherwise agree to our terms and conditions, a contract is formed between you and us.

In order to carry out our obligations under that contract we must process the information you give us. Some of this information may be personal data.

We may use it in order to:

- a) verify your identity for security purposes when you use our services
- b) sell products to you
- c) provide you with our services

d) provide you with suggestions and advice on products, services and how to obtain the most from using our website

We process this information on the basis there is a contract between us, or that you have requested we use the information before we enter into a legal contract.

We shall continue to process this information until the contract between us ends or is terminated by either party under the terms of the contract.

#### 5. Information we process with your consent

Through certain actions when otherwise there is no contractual relationship between us, such as when you browse our website or ask us to provide you more information about our business, including [job opportunities and] our products and services, you provide your consent to us to process information that may be personal data. ## 6. Information we process for the purposes of legitimate interests

We may process information on the basis there is a legitimate interest, either to you or to us, of doing so. Where we process your information on this basis, we do after having given careful consideration to:

- whether the same objective could be achieved through other means
- whether processing (or not processing) might cause you harm
- whether you would expect us to process your data, and whether you would, in the round, consider it reasonable to do so

For example, we may process your data on this basis for the purposes of:

- improving our services
- record-keeping for the proper and necessary administration of our [organisational or business]
- responding to unsolicited communication from you to which we believe you would expect a response
- preventing fraudulent use of our services
- exercising our legal rights, including to detect and prevent fraud and to protect our intellectual property

- insuring against or obtaining professional advice that is required to manage [organisational or business] risk

## 7. Information we process because we have a legal obligation

Sometimes, we must process your information in order to comply with a statutory obligation.

We may use fraud prevention agencies and credit reference agencies to verify your identity and we may pass your information to those agencies if we strongly suspect fraud on our website.

## 8. Our use of aggregated information

We may aggregate anonymous information such as statistical or demographic data for any purpose. Anonymous information is that which does not identify you as an individual. For example, we may aggregate usage information to assess whether a feature of our website is useful.

However, if we combine or connect aggregated information with your personal data so that it can identify you in any way, we treat the combined information as personal data, and it will be used in accordance with this privacy notice.

#### 9. Information you provide

Our website allows you to post information with a view to that information being read, copied, downloaded, or used by other people.

For example, when you leave a review, post a message or otherwise indicate your views on our website, we reasonably assume that you consent for the message to be seen by others. This may include your name, username or any personal data you have included.

In posting personal data, it is up to you to satisfy yourself about the privacy level of every person who might use it.

We do not specifically use this information except to allow it to be displayed or shared.

Once your information enters the public domain, we have no control over what any individual third party may do with it. We accept no responsibility for their actions at any time. Provided your request is reasonable and there is no legal basis for us to retain it, then at our discretion we may agree to your request to delete personal data that you have posted. You can make a request by contacting us

#### 10. Referral partners

This is information given to us by you in your capacity as an affiliate of us or as a referral partner.

It allows us to recognise visitors that you have referred to us, and to credit to you commission due for such referrals. It also includes information that allows us to transfer commission to you.

## 13. Cookies

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer's hard drive by your web browser when you visit a website that uses them. They allow information gathered on one web page to be stored until it is needed for use at a later date. They are commonly used to provide you with a personalised experience while you browse a website, for example, allowing your preferences to be remembered. They can also provide core functionality such as security, network management, and accessibility; record how you interact with the website so that the owner can understand how to improve the experience of other visitors; and serve you advertisements that are relevant to your browsing history.
